From Nixon to Bush: What President Obama Can Learn from Presidents Past

This fall, the Shepperd Public Leadership Institute welcomes Pulitzer Prize winning journalists, Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein.

In the early 1970s, Carl Bernstein and Bob Woodward broke the Watergate story for *The Washington Post* and set the standard for modern investigative reporting, for which they and *The Washington Post* were awarded the Pulitzer Prize. Since then, the pair have written two classic best sellers: *All the President's Men* (also a movie starring Robert Redford and Dustin Hoffman), about their coverage of the Watergate story; and *The Final Days*, about the denouement of the Nixon presidency.

With more #1 best-sellers than any other non-fiction author, Bob Woodward has a reputation for uncovering Washington's untold truths. Called "the most famous investigative reporter in America" by *The New York Times*, he first made headlines when he and Carl Bernstein broke the Watergate story. He again won accolades 30 years later, writing an acclaimed four book series on the inner-working of the Bush administration. At *The Washington Post*, he earned a second Pulitzer as lead reporter for the team that reported on the aftermath of September 11th. Woodward's latest book is titled *The War Within: A Secret White House History 2006-2008*.

Few journalists in America's history have had the impact on their era and their craft as Carl Bernstein. Bernstein has written, among other works, the national bestseller, *A Woman In Charge: The Life of Hillary Rodham*, acclaimed as "a model of political biography" [*Los Angeles Times*], "balanced and convincing" [*New York Times*], and chosen by Amazon.com readers as one of the ten best books of 2007. He is a political analyst for CNN, a contributing editor for *Vanity Fair* magazine, and a former Washington Bureau Chief and correspondent for ABC News. In addition to his political coverage and commentary, Bernstein has written and lectured extensively and critically about the American press, its role and responsibilities.
